Code of Conduct

An important component of maintaining a quality club culture is to set standards of acceptable behaviour which must be upheld by all involved and those participating in the activities and competitions of The Motor Cycling Club. The standards set out in this document apply to all members of The Motor Cycling Club and volunteers who have signed on to support our events.

As a member of The Motor Cycling Club you are expected to abide by the following code of conduct;

- Familiarise yourself with and abide by Motorsport UK/ACU regulations and Standing Supplementary Regulations issued by the MCC
- Co-operate fully and publicly respect all requests and decisions made by Marshals and Event Officials
- Treat all competitors, marshals and officials equally with respect regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity. All members must be welcoming to and encouraging of all other club members
- Make every effort to minimise the impact of your activities on the environment around you
- Maintain the highest standards of driving and riding behaviour
- Conduct yourself in a proper manner at all times and avoid the use of inappropriate language or bullying
- Always behave in the best interests of UK motor sport and as an ambassador for The Motor Cycling Club
- Take responsibility for your own actions and respect the interests of other people and countryside users
- In the use of electronic media; members are expected to be kind and courteous, avoid hate speech or bullying, avoid promotions or scams and respect everyone's privacy

Violations under this Code of Conduct could result in the issue of a warning or in serious cases the suspension and/or termination of membership or association with the club. Should a membership be terminated, the member must remove any association with the club from their vehicle, email, websites and form signatures.
